The Center for Secure Cyberspace thanks all participants of the Time is Money - Typing for Ten Project held in April of 2010 at Louisiana Tech University. The purpose of the data collection effort was to build a large repository of keystroke typing patterns that can be used for evaluating the performance of keystroke based computer user identification and verification systems. The overall number of participants (1,116) for the April effort was very encouraging.

In October 2009, the Center for Secure Cyberspace hosted a data collection effort similar to the April effort, on the campus of Louisiana Tech. This effort was deemed one of the largest keystroke data collections ever undertaken for keystroke authentication research with an overall participant turnover of (1,003).

The Center for Secure Cyberspace will return for a third data collection effort in the Fall of 2010. We would like to take this opportunity to invite all faculty, staff, and students to return for the follow-up event.
